PENTECOST ON THE BLUFF

Memphis is a city on the move. These are not mere platitudes on behalf of the Chamber of Commerce – since I arrived in Memphis, I have been impressed, if not energized, by the movement of this city. From the ancient trade networks of the Mississippian peoples; steamboats, and later barges, on the river; the confluence of rail, trucking, and shipping traffic due to our central location; the Memphis Sound which forces the feet and body to move; to our 21st century friends at FedEx, Memphis knows how to move. Therefore, it only seems appropriate that on Pentecost Day, the Feast Day of the Holy Spirit, we gather at the Mississippi River, a source of such great and powerful movement in our communal life.

In many ways, the Holy Spirit is God on the move. The Spirit “swept over the face” of creation in the first verses of Genesis. The Spirit was breathed into Adam and Eve and gave them life. The Spirit was present when Mary discovered she was pregnant. The Spirit descended upon Jesus at his baptism. And on Pentecost Day, “from heaven there came a sound like the rush of a violent wind, and it filled the entire house where [the disciples] were sitting. Divided tongues, as of fire, appeared among them, and a tongue rested on each of them. All of them were filled with the Holy Spirit.” Today, the Spirit is still moving, inspiring us to worship, calling us to new ministry, calming our weariness, and prodding us toward justice. She is always present, flowing among us, not unlike the river.

On Sunday, June 12, Calvary will worship at 7:45 a.m. on 2nd Street and at 10:00 a.m. at the Ornamental Metal Museum, followed by the Parish Picnic. The 10:00 a.m. service will include joyous jazz music of the Tony Thomas Trio, Holy Spirit kites, a unique and fun sermon for all ages by the Rev. Philip Wiehe, the Renewal of Baptismal Vows (appropriate on a day also known as Whit Sunday, named for the white robes worn by baptismal candidates), and the Holy Eucharist amid the backdrop of ancient trees, fascinating sculpture, and the mighty Mississippi.

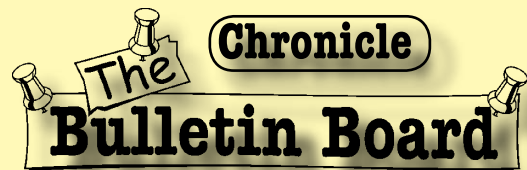
